

**Group Discussion 1, Thursday, June 10.  
ITR Project Achievements**

Table assignments are organized by directorate and division, and by ITR theme. Each table has an assigned discussion leader. The discussion leader will integrate the results of your table's discussion with the results of other tables' discussions on the same ITR theme. One of the theme discussion leaders, or a volunteer, will report to the larger group in the afternoon. Your discussion leader will lead your discussion, take notes, and be the reporter for your group.

**Instructions for Discussion**

1. Each PI and co-PI at the table should spend a few minutes filling out the worksheet to prepare for the group discussion. The worksheet is on the next page.
2. Introduce each person and project, no more than 10 minutes each. PIs and co-PIs can refer to their poster.
3. Using a round robin approach, start the discussion on the questions that follow. The discussion leader should record the information and ideas generated by each person in the group. You may use a flip chart or laptop to take notes.
4. The group should decide on three key ideas from the discussion.

**ITR Project Achievement Discussion Questions**

- ◆ How did the ITR make a difference in helping to educate and train students and others, and build links to the community? (GPRA goal- People)
- ◆ How did the ITR make a difference in increasing knowledge across disciplines? (GPRA goal- Ideas)
- ◆ How did the ITR contribute to the science and engineering infrastructure? (GPRA goal - Tools)
- ◆ Other consequences: How did the ITR led to further research collaborations, more interdisciplinary work, new lines of work or new grants, new products, and so forth?
